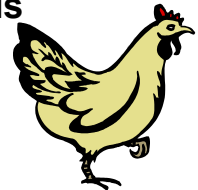
If you are affected by the proposed Traveston Crossing Dam or the new Bruce Highway and have to move, or you're thinking about moving, and can't take your

**Mary Valley Animal Refugee Group** (MVARG) has been formed by locals to provide advice to people affected by the Dam or the Highway proposals on alternatives for animals that:

- you cannot take with you if you have to move,
- need our help with their care and upkeep,
- need to find temporary accommodation until you are settled in your new place, or manage to find alternate housing for them.

We will try our hardest to re-home your animals. Even working dogs can be catered for.

We have a list of people offering temporary or permanent housing for all kinds of animals.

There are also **MVARG** volunteers that will help you catch your animal if you are elderly, alone, have a disability or a health problem .

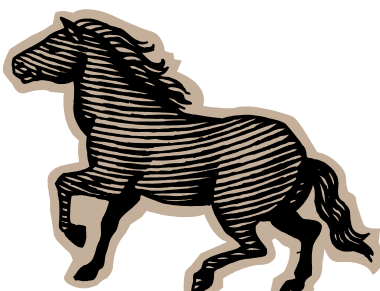
QLD RSPCA and the DPI&F have offered their support to this local community initiative.
